





Adult Small Group: New 6-Week Class

In Romans 12:2, Paul exhorts us to be transformed to a life pleasing to God. For six Sundays, Oct. 17 through Nov. 21, the Sunday Morning Adult Small Group will examine the transformed lives of six people who helped to bring us all closer to God. Please join us in the Mill Creek Room or via Zoom at 9:00 a.m. All are welcome.

This morning, we discussed **Lucretia Mott** who was a 19th-century feminist activist, abolitionist, social reformer, and pacifist who helped launch the women's rights movement. She co-wrote the Declaration of Sentiments in 1848 for the first Women's Rights Convention in Seneca Falls, New York, and helped found co-educational Swarthmore College in Pennsylvania 1864.

The rest of the schedule is as follows:

Oct. 31—Harriet Tubman (*My Steps Are Ordered by God*, Psalm 37:5, 23-24)

Known as the "Moses of her people," Harriet Tubman was enslaved, and helped others gain their freedom as a "conductor" of the Underground Railroad. Tubman also served as a scout, spy, guerrilla soldier, and nurse for the Union Army during the Civil War. She is considered the first African American woman to serve in the military.

Nov. 7—Katherine Mary Drexel (*Sell All You Have and Follow the Lord*, Mark 10:21 and Luke 12:33-34)

Katherine Mary Drexel used her personal fortune to fund schools for Native Americans and African Americans. She was canonized in 2000.

Nov. 14—Richard Allen (*Do We Not All Have One Father?*, Malachi 2:10)

Born into slavery in 1760, Richard Allen later bought his freedom and went on to found the first national Black church in the United States, the African Methodist Episcopal Church, in 1816 in Philadelphia.

Nov. 21—Fanny Crosby (*Shout for Joy*, Psalm 98:1-7)

Frances Jane van Alstyne, more commonly known as Fanny Crosby, was an American mission worker, poet, lyricist, and composer. She was a prolific hymnist, writing more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs, with more than 100 million copies printed. She is also known for her teaching and her rescue mission work. By the end of the 19th century, she was a household name.


Three of the pledges we've received so far are *new* this year!

Pastor's Corner

Last Sunday, I began my sermon speaking of the way Bono once introduced Eugene Peterson. I thought a lot about Peterson and what his ministry of the written word has done for my soul and career. My mind took me to a video I saw four years ago when Bono desired to speak with Peterson about the Psalms. Eugene Peterson served a Presbyterian Church outside Washington, D.C. for nearly thirty years and later became professor of practical theology in Canada. In this video, Bono greets Peterson and his wife, Jan, in their Montana home not long before Peterson's death. I pray a Psalm every night before I drift off to sleep because the words allow my heart to be honest with God. I hope you will enjoy this [video](#) as two unlikely friends discuss the Psalms.



Local Outreach Ministry: Ardmore Food Pantry

The Ardmore Food Pantry is housed at St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Ardmore and is asking for staple food items as well as paper bags with handles and reusable plastic bags.

Staple food items include: cereals, canned meals, pasta, spaghetti sauce, hearty soups, mac & cheese, bottled dressings, canned tuna, chicken, salmon, granola bars, oatmeal (packets), canned vegetables and beans, sliced bread, snacks, peanut butter & jelly, canned or cups of fruit and applesauce, mayonnaise (smaller sizes), crackers (saltines or Ritz).
