#### CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

SECOND READING, Hebrews 4:14-5:10, 7:23-28

Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness, and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest but was appointed by the one who said to him,

"You are my Son;

today I have begotten you";

as he says also in another place,

"You are a priest forever,

according to the order of Melchizedek."

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered, and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Furthermore, the former priests were many in number because they were prevented by death from continuing in office, but he holds his priesthood permanently because he continues forever. Consequently, he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests humans, who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.

This is the word of God for the people of God.

# Call for Volunteers! Code Blue Emergency Shelter

Lower Merion faith communities are once again coordinating a Code Blue Shelter to house up to five men on nights when the real feel is 32° or below. The shelter will run from November 2024 through March 2025 when Montgomery County officially declares a Code Blue.



Montgomery County defines Code Blue as "when the temperature and/or wind chill is expected to be at or below 32° Fahrenheit for two or more hours."

Code Blue shelters open at 9:00 p.m. and close at 6:00 a.m. Host churches will provide snacks at night and a breakfast sandwich to guests in the morning.

APC will host the Code Blue Shelter in the Mill Creek Room as needed during the month of December and we need your help!

Volunteers work in teams of two over two shifts each night: 8:30 p.m. -1:30 a.m. and 1:30 - 6:30 a.m. Volunteers will welcome those brought to the shelter by LMPD and other service providers and offer monitoring and assistance as needed. Volunteers have 24-hour access to support professionals who can assist by phone and respond on-site as needed.

Individuals with clinical and/or social work experience (social workers, nurses, physicians, clinical counselors, EMTs, etc.) are encouraged to volunteer, but all 18 and over are welcome.

All volunteers must provide a criminal background check (documentation on file from last year is still valid) before their first shift. Details for obtaining your background check will be provided after you sign up. There will be volunteer training specific to each location. The first is Tuesday, October 22, 7:00 p.m. at Ardmore United Methodist Church.
